### 54-096 CALL TO ORDER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Raeleen Reinhardt called the USD 407 Board of Education regular meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. in the Central Administration Office Boardroom. Additional board members in attendance were Mr. Brett Mai, Mrs. Deanna Myers, Dr. Joyce Ellis, Mrs. Kathy Wallert, and Mr. Ron Wedel. Ms. Swayne led the group in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Mrs. Crystal Waymaster arrived later during the meeting.

Administrators in attendance were Ms. Shelly Swayne, Superintendent; Mr. Andrew Dempewolf, Bickerdyke Elementary School Principal; Mrs. Katie Revell, Simpson Elementary School Principal; and Ms. Brenda Odgers, Special Education Director. Jordan Perez, Principal of Ruppenthal Middle School, joined the meeting via Google Meet. Mr. Joshua Stephenson, Principal of Russell High School, arrived later during the meeting.

Cody Campbell, IT Director, and Board Clerk Jane Cline were also in attendance. Guests in the audience signed an attendance roster.

### 54-097 ORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD

## A. Elect President of the Board

Mrs. Reinhardt opened nominations for Board President. Mr. Mai nominated Mrs. Wallert as president. Mrs. Myers nominated Mrs. Reinhardt as president. Nominations ceased and votes were cast.

Kathy Wallert was voted in as Board President for the 2022 calendar year with four votes. Members voting for Mrs. Wallert included: Dr. Ellis, Mr. Mai, Mrs. Wallert, and Mr. Wedel. Mrs. Reinhardt and Mrs. Myers voted in favor of Mrs. Reinhardt.

The gavel was passed from Mrs. Reinhardt to Mrs. Wallert who then took the leadership

role and progressed through the meeting.

At 5:32 p.m., Mrs. Waymaster joined the meeting.

## B. Elect Vice-President of the Board

Mrs. Wallert opened nominations for vice-president. Mrs. Reinhardt nominated Dr. Ellis and Mrs. Wallert nominated Mr. Mai. Nominations ceased and votes were taken.

Dr. Ellis was elected as Board Vice-President with votes from Mrs. Reinhardt, Mrs. Myers, Mr. Wedel, Mrs. Waymaster and herself. Mr. Mai abstained from voting but received a vote from Mrs. Wallert.

## C. Establish Meeting Dates and Times

Mr. Mai read *Resolution 54-197C Regular* to establish regular meeting dates for the 2022 calendar year. Mr. Mai then made a motion to adopt the resolution as read. Mr. Wedel seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 - 0.

Discussion was held on establishing special meeting dates for the 2022 calendar year to create Board Goals updates and develop Strategic Planning/Vision.

Mrs. Reinhardt read *Resolution 54-197C Special* to establish special meetings for January through June 2022. Mrs. Reinhardt made a motion to adopt the resolution for special meeting dates as read. Mr. Mai seconded the motion. Motion carried 7-0.

Marcia Gier, Kansas State Research and Extension 4-H and Youth Development Agent, and Superintendent Shelly Swayne accepted the donation.

#### **54-100 FY2021 AUDIT REVIEW**

Randy Ford from Busby, Ford and Reimer, LLC (BFR) reviewed the 2020-2021 fiscal year audit. Mr. Wedel moved, and Mr. Mai seconded a motion to accept the Financial Statement for the 2020-2021 school year as prepared by Busby, Ford, and Reimer. Motion carried 7-0.

## 54-101 DATA DIVE - SEMESTER 1 DATA FOR ALL SCHOOLS

Building administrators provided Quarter 2 student performance reviews for their respective building. Delivery of the information was presented as a parent-teacher conference with the Board of Education. Ms. Swayne reported on behalf of Russell High School.

## 54-102 DISCUSSION ITEMS

Mr. Stephenson, Russell High School Principal, arrived at 6:40 p.m.

### A. Covid Protocol Review - Gating Committee Recommendation

Mr. Wedel reviewed the COVID mitigation plans developed by the Mitigation Committee. The only difference between the two plans were the benchmarks where action could be taken. Current absentee rates were broken down between attendance centers.

Mr. Wedel made a motion to adopt Plan B as submitted by the Mitigation Committee. Mrs. Reinhardt seconded the motion. Motion carried 6 - 1. Mrs. Wallert voted in opposition.

#### B. District Calendar 2022-2023

Mrs. Myers made a motion to adopt Calendar C2 for the 2022-2023 school year. Dr. Ellis seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 - 0.

## C. Asbestos Removal Bids - Simpson Elementary School

Only one bid was received for the asbestos abatement at Simpson Elementary School and Ruppenthal Middle School. Ms. Swayne recommended acceptance of the bid for Simpson Elementary School. Mr. Wedel asked about locking in the bid amount for asbestos removal at Ruppenthal Middle School for a future project. A response to the request will be

presented at the January 24, 2022, special meeting.

Mrs. Reinhardt made a motion to accept the ACM Removal bid for asbestos removal at Simpson Elementary School in the amount of \$62,650. Mrs. Myers seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 - 0.

## D. December 15 Storm Update and Discussion

Ms. Swayne shared storm damage updates as an official inclusion to the packet. Ms. Swayne addressed questions related to the storm damage incurred and reported the damaged buses will be reinspected by Kansas Highway Patrol prior to putting the buses back in service. Mr. Mai recommended relocating the bus barn should it be rebuilt because the ground grade is not correct as there was significant water damage to the bus barn as water was draining into the facility.

## E. Early Childhood Educational Planning

Mrs. Revell introduced discussions taking place for serving future students at Simpson Elementary School. Planning strategies for the early childhood and kindergarten populations were outlined. Mrs. Revell requested direction from the Board at the February regular meeting. Discussion followed where Mr. Wedel requested additional costs associated with the proposed changes and feedback from the staff's point of view.

## F. Board Policy Handbook Revisions - KASB Recommendations - 1st Reading

The Kansas Association of School Boards (KASB) December 2021 policy update recommendations were presented for a first reading. Formal approval will be requested at the February 14, 2022, meeting.

Mr. Mai requested Mr. Duden research the possibility of hiring a first-year student attending NCK Technical College to assist with the LED switch outs at Ruppenthal Middle School and Russell High School.

## D. Special Education Director

Mrs. Odgers briefed the board on upcoming events and modifications made within the special education environment.

#### E. Activities Director

Mr. Stephenson highlighted student achievements and briefed the board on activities taking place at Russell High School.

## F. Food Service Director

Inquiries were made on expected dates for the feasibility studies requested from food service management vendors. Ms. Swayne reported the dishwasher in need of replacement is awaiting certified personnel to complete the installation.

## **G.** Technology Director

Mr. Campbell reported Nex-tech technicians were on site to check on the electronic door access issues and noted the Nex-tech equipment is not the culprit. Door hardware appears to be causing problems and needs to be replaced. Consensus of the board was to move forward with needed updates.

## H. Legislative Report

Mrs. Wallert highlighted a list of bills affecting education during the 2022 legislative session. Mrs. Wallert also reported that she will not be attending the Washington DC conference due to health issues.

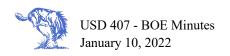
