

Commodity Supplemental Food Program

The Kansas Food Bank is providing CSFP food boxes for low income seniors in Russell County at the Agape Center, 527 N Maple St in Russell. This program does not replace any other food program, it is an additional safety net. Seniors must enroll and qualify to receive the monthly food box. Boxes are distributed monthly.

The 2023 income guidelines are gross income before Medicare or any other type of expense is deducted from Social Security check or wages.

WHAT DOES A SENIOR NEED TO APPLY?

- Valid driver's license or state ID for everyone in your household
- Proof of Address – utility bill, lease rental agreement, bank statement
 - Only needed if you do not have an ID with your current address on it
- Proof of income - pay stubs for the past 30 days or a social security statement, unemployment and any retirement information such pension received.
 - (unfortunately we cannot accept copies of bank statements)

WHAT FOODS ARE PROVIDED TO PARTICIPANTS?

Food packages include a variety of foods, such as nonfat dry and ultra-high temperature fluid milk, juice, farina, oats, ready-to-eat cereal, rice, pasta, peanut butter, dry beans, canned meat, poultry or fish, and canned fruits and vegetables.
